Students celebrated their pride in the U.A.E. by wearing clothes in the colors of the national flag.





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



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STEAM Clubs

Dancing and physical activity helps the students develop a positive attitude towards their daily challenges. The students showed us their moves in this energetic and mood boosting activity.








SLO[®] Stories
