The picnic was a wonderful experience for the students. They learned new words, had fun with their friends, and made memories that they will cherish for a long time to come.




Science Fair



Overall, the shows were the result of the students' hard work, dedication, and passion for gymnastics and ballet. They were also a delightful addition to the year's events.






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
